Historian Irma Clifton will portray woman's rights leader Elizabeth Cady Stanton. Stanton was author of some of the most influential books and speeches of the women's rights movement both in this country and in Europe. She began her formal activism with the Seneca Falls Convention in 1848 asserting that women had certain rights, among which was the right to vote. She was an activist until her death in 1902, in many cases championing rights for

women beyond what others in the women's movement considered appropriate. Irma is president of the Lorton Heritage Society and is Museum Collections Manager at the Workhouse Prison Museum in Lorton. She will be in period costume for us. Bring a friend or family member to help us honor Women's History Month.

#### AAUW of Virginia State Lobby Day

Ali, Jeanne, and Sandy lobbied with other AAUW of VA members in Richmond on February 5.

The day started with attending the LWV Women's Legislative Roundtable. From there, members met with the Speaker of the House Speaker William Howell and Lieutenant Governor Ralph Northam to drop off the Equal Pay Petition with all the signatures collected and discuss other legislative interests of AAUW. Caroline Pickens (AAUW of VA president) and Sandy met with Secretary of Education Holt on to discuss AAUW report "Women in Community Colleges" and how AAUW VA can support her office.



#### AAUW of Virginia 2014 Voting and Elections Announcement: Paper Ballots vs. Online Voting

It is already time to begin thinking about AAUW of Virginia's annual one-memberone-vote election, which will take place between April 29 and May 29. Because paper ballots raise the cost considerably, all members are encouraged to vote online. Last year 787 paper ballots were mailed to members at a cost of \$811.73, over 40% of the total cost. Only 98 of these ballots were cast. On the recommendation of the Voting and Elections committee, the Board voted for an opt-in rather than an opt-out process for receiving a paper ballot. Branches can encourage online voting by

Branches can encourage online voting by bringing laptops or tablets to the May branch meeting to allow members to vote there. Those who will need a paper ballot can request one between January 22 and April 6 by calling Mary K Johnson at 703 913 9490, emailing her at johnsons7703@verizon.net, or writing to her at 7703 Griffin Pond Court, Springfield, VA 22153. She will need each member's AAUW ID number, branch, and address.

All members who have joined by March 31, 2014, are eligible to vote. The quorum for the election is 7% of all members of AAUW of Virginia. For more details, see the winter/spring edition of the *Vision*.

#### **Member Recognition**

The Long Term Care Ombudsman Program seeks to be the "voice" for the voiceless and insure that residents' rights are upheld and that care standards are high. They make certain that our local skilled nursing and assisted living residents know that Prince William County cares about them.

These dedicated volunteers visit local skilled nursing and assisted living residents each and every week and get to know the residents and the staff. They make sure that proper care is being given and that any concerns are addressed. They mediate on behalf of residents and their families and attend resident council meetings as an outside representative to listen without bias.

These devoted volunteers feel so strongly about their mission of helping skilled nursing and assisted living residents that, in the first quarter of 2013, they handled 154 complaints and 176 issues in their respective facilities. There are five skilled nursing and nine assisted living facilities with almost 700 beds in Prince William County and all of the residents need to be visited and concerns/complaints need to be addressed.

Although the new budget year brought this program "in-house" to the Prince William Area Agency on Aging, we did not know if the volunteers would be willing to continue with the program since they were used to working elsewhere. They said, "YES!" They have served Prince William County for several years but they did so through the Fairfax Area Agency on Aging as part of the Regional Long Term Care Ombudsman Program. They could have declined to volunteer in Prince William and been assigned to facilities in another county or they could have quit, but instead these Prince William County residents stayed to serve! These five have commitment!

#### 2014 Girls + Math + Science = SUCCESS! Conference

The 24th annual "Girls + Math + Science = SUCCESS!" Conference will be held on Saturday, March 22nd, at Marsteller Middle School in Bristow. The Woodbridge Branch has supported this conference since 1995. We usually schedule it during Women's History Month after the Prince William Regional Science Fair. The title is from a 1990 program on the West Coast and for us, has evolved from only non-traditional careers in Math and Science being presented to Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts, and Mathematics (S.T.E.A.M.) careers, women's history, gender neutral education, and workshops for adults, too. Our major corporate sponsors are working with us again; SPARK- the Prince William County Education Foundation- is our co-presenter; and presenters are being invited as the newsletter goes to press. We have been awarded a \$100 VA AAUW impact aid grant toward materials for participants, too! Almost every color in the t-shirt spectrum has been used so when I was visiting Susan F. I noticed that of her four star balloons- one was a new color: kelly green. Using Susan's special yellow from 2009 for the lettering will work well.

We will have a display table for AAUW as usual with membership materials and all of our presenters will receive membership packets. Our recent scrapbooks will be displayed, too. -1,528 visit to congressional offices	-Lobbied on 14 bills or issues
-Successfully added over 500 cosponsors to bills	-3 bills passed
-Visited every state and territory office	-Made one visit to 84% of the Representatives

-Visited 100% of the Senators
