The October meeting was our participation in the PWC NOW Stand for Women NOW Voter Registration & Equality Rally on October 10. The PWC NOW chapter started about a year ago and this event was held at Pfitzner Stadium. From 2-4 pm, organizations set up tables with displays outside the stadium. Our booth was next to the League of Women Voters and we networked with other participants and recruited new member. The following members staffed the booth: Sandy Lawrence, Susan Bardenhagen, Ali Cohen, Lyndsay Wilshaw, and Sara B. Anderson. At 4pm the rally began inside the stadium with a welcome from Hala Ayala, president of PWC NOW. There were many speakers including Eleanor Smeal, Co-Founder of the Feminist Majority, Jennifer Lawless, Professor of Government at American University, Bonnie Grabenhofer, National NOW VP, Tarina Keene, NARAL VA Executive Director, Pat Wirth, Turning Point Suffragist Memorial Executive Director and several others. Local candidates running for office in the November 3 election were introduced. This Stand for Women Rally was the first ever and PWC NOW hopes it will become an annual event.

Networking Builds Membership Contacts – A Case in Point

I wasn't sure what to expect at the Prince William NOW Event, "Stand for Women NOW: Voter Registration & Equality Rally," on October 10th. Who would be there? What would we be doing? What should I bring/wear? I was looking forward to the day and the weather was absolutely perfect! Sara Anderson knew we should be part of this event and "sponsored" us.

Sara, Sandy, Ali, Lyndsay, and I shared representing our branch's table area- a prime location, I might add- from 1:30 until 5. We had a wide variety of AAUW literature- something for everyone- and SUCCESS! Conference items to share. We were bookended by a PWC School Board member and the League of Women Voters. Across the walkway, usually used by Potomac Nationals fans to enter Pfitzner Stadium, we were greeted by a fellow musician and lawyer, as well as a woman who works with Joyce Eagles and has her own business. Other groups included many political ones, a cool titled "Damsel in Defense", Mary Kay cosmetics, and health professionals.

The wonderful part was the networking among the groups. The visitors included political candidates mainly, with their families- we all chatted and shared. I was able to share with many who stopped at our table about the SUCCESS! Conference and our STEM outreach. All of us wear many hats and while our objective was to garner interested people to become AAUW Woodbridge members, our expertise in preserving history, the arts, education, and lobbying came in handy for connecting with those in attendance. Networking made for new contacts and we were able to share much of AAUW's mission.

We met women from the Richmond area who are excited to get in touch with our "satellite" SUCCESS! program- Della and the Greater Richmond branch's "Full STEAM Ahead!" in June. Two interested women from Stafford and Fauquier locations are seriously considering coming a bit north like Lindsay to join a branch closer, and most importantly- active. ⁽²⁾ Three more Prince William women signed up as prospective members and I hope to include many of the aforementioned on our rosters soon. The variety of our programs and days/settings are appealing!

The program began in the stadium, opened by a Girl Scout troop's color guard with PWC Supervisor Jenkins leading the invocation, noting he is "running for re-election." The event chair, Hala Ayala, was exhilarated as she introduced speakers and shared the vision her PWC NOW board members have. The Vice-President of NOW, Bonnie Grabenhofer, presented current statistics- did you know that 2/3 of the minimum wage earners are women? I didn't.

From VA NOW, Diana Egozcue countered the argument that the 14th amendment which is often "offered" to women as "all that is needed," does NOT speak for women, as she championed the ratification of the ERA- Equal Rights Amendment. Next, nine candidates (or their representatives) gave brief campaign speeches. Feminist Majority's Eleanor Smeal reminded the about 100+ audience members that family planning is an everyone issue, only 11 votes made Mark Herring our Virginia attorney general, and the ERA passed the Senate four times. Tarina Keene, of VA NARAL and past president of VA NOW, surprised us with the data that there have been more attacks on women's rights in the last five years than in the last forty years. 49/140 of Virginia's General Assembly are pro-choice, all three of VA's top leaders (governor, lieutenant governor, and attorney general) elected in 2013 are as well.

Emerge Virginia's Kate reported the disappointing percentages of women in elected offices in Virginia and nationally- something our member, Manassas Park City Councilwoman Jeanette Rishell has

compiled for us at the SUCCESS! Conference for several years now. Pat Wirth, Turning Point Suffrage Memorial in Lorton, shared a video on suffrage that I believe needs to be shared with EVERYONE! Maybe for our movie day? =)

The keynote speaker, Jennifer Lawless, works to empower women to run for elected office and try to counteract the feelings that many women have- that they are less qualified. "Put yourselves forward!" This is another theme our branch has championed, not only for us, but our northern Virginia district, with Jeanette's leadership.
