Directions to Ali's:

4287 Newbold Court in Woodbridge, near the McCoart Building. Ali's phone number is 703-878-3460.

Three roads intersect where you will travel Ridgefield Road (from Dale City), Prince William Parkway (coming from Lake Ridge) and Greatbridge which is directly across from where Ridgefield Road intersects the Parkway from the south. Directions here are given as if one were to be driving from Lake Ridge intersection of PWC Parkway and Greatbridge (Ruby Tuesday will be on your left on the corner); turn right and go to the roundabout.

Take the first right off of the roundabout (Asdee Lane). Follow Asdee until it T intersects with Coventry Glen Drive. Turn right on Coventry Glen and follow it until it T intersects @Tideswell Mill Court. Turn right onto Tideswell Mill Ct. Follow Tideswell Mill Ct. to the first (and only) left which is Newbold Court. Turn left onto Newbold. Ali's home is on the right hand side where the cul-de-sac begins. The number is 4287.
