CALL FOR SCIENCE FAIR JUDGES!

Be part of the AAUW Woodbridge Branch judging team at the PWC Regional Science Fair Saturday, March 16, at the **Kelley Leadership Center**, **14715 Bristow Road Manassas**, VA 20112. Judges are asked to arrive by 8

a.m. to enjoy light refreshments and participate in a brief welcome and overview of the day's events. Then our judging team divides up the exhibits to be evaluated.

The Science Fair was created for Prince William/Manassas area students to exhibit independent research projects in the fields of science, mathematics, engineering, and computer science. We will judge just the Middle School (Seventh and Eighth grades girls' exhibits. These are critical years when many girls begin to lose interest in or their confidence begins to wane in the STEM fields. AAUW strongly advocates for girls to excel in STEM school subjects and to consider careers in these areas given the robust job market and potential for advancement, economic security and opportunities to serve in leadership roles.

This year, we will select a first, second, and third place and one honorable mention winning exhibit. Optimally, we need a team of five or six judges to be able to visit all the exhibits and make our final decisions by 11:30 a.m. and have time to personalize the certificates and small gifts in preparation for the afternoon award ceremony that is held at 3:00 p.m. Judges are not required to attend the award ceremony but are most welcome to do so!

2013 GIRLS + MATH + SCIENCE = SUCCESS! CONFERENCE

The 23rd annual SUCCESS! Conference presented by our Woodbridge Branch and SPARK- the Prince William County Education Foundation- will be held on Sat, April 6th. Marsteller Middle School, in Bristow, is hosting the conference for the tenth year.

The conference is for students in grades 5-12 and the adults in their lives; parents, educators, and community leaders. Students' workshops are on careers in the Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics (STEAM); women's history; and career planning. Adult workshops address gender equity, supporting students' careers goals, financial planning for post-high school, and updates in the STEAM fields.

We are dedicating this year's conference to **Dr. Sally Ride**, who tragically succumbed to pancreatic cancer last summer. Sally, her Sally Ride Science programs, and the Sally Ride Science Festivals at local George Mason were all supporters of the SUCCESS!
